EPHRATA TOWNSHIP SUPERVISORS' MEETING

March 19, 2024

The Ephrata Township Supervisors met this date at 7:00 a.m. at the Ephrata Township Office Building, 265 Akron Road, Ephrata, Pennsylvania.

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Clark Stauffer followed by the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

PUBLIC COMMENTS NON-AGENDA ITEMS

There was no one in attendance to provide public comment on an item that was not on the agenda.

A motion was made by Ty Zerbe to close the Public Comment Period. The motion was seconded by Tony Haws and carried unanimously.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

A motion was made by Tony Haws to dispense with the reading of the March 5, 2024 Supervisors' minutes and to approve them as presented. The motion was seconded by Ty Zerbe and carried unanimously.

2023 FINANCIAL STATEMENTS – MEGAN THOMPSON, HERBEIN + COMPANY INC.

Megan Thompson of Herbein + Company Inc. was present. Megan presented a summary and overview of the 2023 Financial Statements and stated that the Township had an unmodified (clean) opinion. The Township switched to Modified Cash Basis instead of Accrual Basis in 2022 as was recommended by Trout CPA. The Township used Trout CPA for many years as their auditing firm for both the Township and Sewer Authority. Trout had informed the Township in the Spring of 2023 that their company had planned to down-size their number of clients due to staffing difficulties. Herbein was selected to replace Trout and staff stated that they were extremely happy with the transition from Trout to Herbein. The Financial Statements will be kept on file at the Township Office.

JIM MARTIN – 503 ALEXANDER DRIVE – WAIVER OF LAND DEVELOPMENT PLAN PROCESSING

The Township received a letter and Waiver of Land Development Plan Processing request from Pioneer Engineering on behalf of Concept Excavating, 503 Alexander Drive. Manager Sawyer presented to the Board of Supervisors a narrative of the proposed project to construct a 60' x 95' addition onto the existing building for equipment storage. In the fall of 2023, 503 Alexander Drive submitted a Storm Water Management Plan for an expansion of the stone storage area on the property. The building addition is proposed to be located on an existing impervious surface and the additional roof runoff will be piped directly to the storm water management basin. Jim Caldwell reviewed the modification request and documentation provided by Pioneer Management and recommended approval of the request. Ty Zerbe requested that Rettew Associates review the storm water pipe size to ensure it would be able to handle the storm water flow from the proposed building addition.

A motion was made by Ty Zerbe approving the Waiver of Land Development Plan Processing for 503 Alexander Drive subject to the Rettew Associates email dated March 13, 2024 and Rettew verifying that the existing storm water pipe will be adequate to convey the roof runoff from the proposed addition. The motion was seconded by Tony Haws and carried unanimously.

STAFF REPORTS

Manager Steve Sawyer

- **Roofing Proposal – Moser Roofing.** Manager Sawyer provided the Board of Supervisors with a Memorandum dated March 7, 2024 recommending approval of a proposal from Moser Roofing to replace the asphalt shingle roof on the municipal building. Four (4) Co-Star proposals were received and Moser Roofing Solutions was the lowest quote that was received. The Moser proposal included payment terms of 20% upon signing the proposal, 60% at the time the work begins and the remaining 20% upon the completion date. Manager Sawyer stated that he spoke to Moser Roofing and they are willing to change the payment terms to 100% due at the completion of the project.

A motion was made by Tony Haws to approve the proposal for the roof replacement for the Ephrata Township Municipal Building to Moser Roofing Solutions in the amount of \$58,500.00. The motion was seconded by Ty Zerbe and carried unanimously.

- **Hammon Avenue – Borough /Township Paving Project.** Manager Sawyer stated that approximately two (2) weeks ago the Township found out that Ephrata Borough was planning to repave Hammon Avenue this year. There is approximately 400 feet of Hammon Avenue in Ephrata Township from the Township/Borough line to Meadow Valley Road. Manager Sawyer recommended that the Board approve participating in an intermunicipal project with Ephrata Borough to pave Hammon Avenue from Academy Drive to Meadow Valley Road.

The Borough will bid the project with the Township portion as an option on the bid. The Township would have the opportunity to decide on moving forward or not with the project when the bids are received. If the Board approves moving forward, the Borough Solicitor will prepare an intermunicipal agreement for the project

A motion was made by Tony Haws authorizing staff to move forward with the project to include the Township's portion of Hammon Avenue with the Ephrata Borough bid for the project. The motion was seconded by Ty Zerbe and carried unanimously.

- **East Mohler Church Road – Ridge Avenue Intersection – Additional Signage.** Ephrata Township received a complaint from a Ridge Avenue resident concerning the East Mohler Church Road – Ridge Avenue intersection. Manager Sawyer contacted the Ephrata Police Department to request an accident history for the intersection and a speed study for East Mohler Church Road. The EPD provided the accident history and the speed study and Manager Sawyer forwarded the information to John Schick from Rettew. John Schick recommended additional signage at the intersection. Manager Sawyer showed the Board of Supervisors photos of signage installed by PennDOT at the Schoeneck Road – Springville Road intersection several years ago. Manager Sawyer recommended that the Board approve additional intersection ahead signs and pavement markings on East Mohler Church Road based on the recommendation of the Township's Traffic Engineer.

A motion was made by Ty Zerbe authorizing staff to move forward with the additional signage and pavement markings per the recommendation of the Township Traffic Engineer. The motion was seconded by Tony Haws and carried unanimously.

- **Disposition of Records.** Staff prepared a Resolution for the Disposition of Township Records. The proposed disposition of Township records was in accordance with the PA Records Manual.

A motion was made by Tony Haws to approve the disposition of Township records as identified on the Resolution. The motion was seconded by Ty Zerbe and carried unanimously.

- **LCATS – Spring Meeting.** Manager Sawyer stated that the Township received an invitation to the Spring LCATS Meeting. The meeting will be held on April 30th at “The Gathering Place” in Mount Joy beginning at 5:30 p.m. RSVPs are needed to be sent to LCATS by April 16th.

Township Engineer Jim Caldwell reported that the following plans/projects are in the review process:

APPROVAL OF BILLS

A motion was made by Ty Zerbe to accept the list of checks written and to pay any bills pending. The motion was seconded by Tony Haws and carried unanimously.

CORRESPONDENCE

Tony Haws reported that he attended the Public Safety Meeting at the Borough last evening. The Township Maintenance Department was recognized for their efforts during the Martin's Country Market fire. The Township Maintenance Department spread salt on the parking lot around the store and also at several off-site locations where the fire companies were getting water to fight the fire.

Clark Stauffer stated that the Ephrata Joint Water Authority is working with the Authority Engineer to determine what can be done to improve fire service to the western side of their service area.

A motion was made by Tony Haws to adjourn the meeting at 8:16 A.M. The motion was seconded by Ty Zerbe and carried unanimously.

**A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE
TOWNSHIP OF EPHRATA, LANCASTER COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA
AUTHORIZING ENTRANCE INTO AN INTERGOVERNMENTAL
COOPERATION AGREEMENT TO ALLOW COOPERATION WITH
EPHRATA BOROUGH IN BIDDING AND MANAGING CONSTRUCTION
OF CERTAIN ROAD IMPROVEMENTS IN EPHRATA BOROUGH AND
EPHRATA TOWNSHIP, LANCASTER COUNTY**

WHEREAS, Ephrata Township, Lancaster County, has the authority, pursuant to 53 P.S. § 66507, to enter into agreements with other political subdivisions, in accordance with existing laws, in performing government powers and duties and functions and in carrying into effect provisions of law relating to subjects which are common to such political subdivisions; and

WHEREAS, Ephrata Borough, Lancaster County, similarly has the authority, pursuant to 53 P.S. § 66507 to enter into the same type of agreements; and

WHEREAS, Ephrata Borough intends to undertake a roadway improvement project consisting of removal of existing pavement, installation of new leveling and wearing courses, installation of pavement markings, replacement of stormwater inlets where applicable, and replacement of existing ADA ramps as necessary on a portion of Hammon Avenue located within the limits of Ephrata Borough (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, Ephrata Township has an interest in doing the same for a 400 LF portion of Hammon Avenue located inside Ephrata Township's boundaries; and

WHEREAS, Ephrata Borough and Ephrata Township desire to enter into an Intergovernmental Cooperation Agreement ("Agreement") for Ephrata Borough to include certain areas of Ephrata Township in the scope of its Project to be bid so that both Ephrata Township and Ephrata Borough may realize beneficial cost savings through a reimbursement arrangement; and

WHEREAS, Ephrata Borough and Ephrata Township agree that it would be in the best interest of its respective citizens to enter into said Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board of Supervisors of Ephrata Township, Lancaster County, Pennsylvania hereby resolves as follows:

SECTION 1: AUTHORIZATION OF AGREEMENT.

- A. The above recitals are incorporated herein by reference thereto and made a part of this Resolution.

- B. The Board of Supervisors of Ephrata Township hereby resolves to enter into an Intergovernmental Cooperation Agreement with Ephrata Borough to include certain areas of Hammon Avenue in Ephrata Township in the scope of Ephrata Borough's Project to be bid.

SECTION 2: TERMS OF AGREEMENT

The Intergovernmental Cooperation Agreement between Ephrata Borough and Ephrata Township is attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated herein by reference.

SECTION 3. SEVERABILITY

If any sentence, clause, section, or part of this Resolution is for any reason found unconstitutional, illegal, or invalid, such unconstitutionality, illegality, or invalidity shall not affect or impair any of the remaining provisions, sentences, clauses, sections, or parts hereof. It is hereby declared the intent of the Board of Supervisors of Ephrata Township that this Resolution would have been adopted had such unconstitutional, illegal, or invalid sentence, clause, section or part thereof not been included therein.

SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Resolution shall take effect immediately.

EXHIBIT A

Intergovernmental Cooperation Agreement between Ephrata Borough and Ephrata Township

INTERGOVERNMENTAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT ("Agreement") is made this ____ day of _____, 2024, by and between **EPHRATA BOROUGH**, a Pennsylvania borough with offices at 124 S. State Street, Ephrata, Pennsylvania 17522 ("Ephrata Borough"), and **EPHRATA TOWNSHIP**, a Pennsylvania Township of the Second Class with offices at 265 Akron Road, Ephrata, Pennsylvania 17522 ("Ephrata Township") (collectively, "Parties").

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, Ephrata Borough intends to undertake a roadway improvement project consisting of removal of existing pavement, installation of new leveling and wearing courses, installation of pavement markings, replacement of stormwater inlets where applicable, and replacement of existing ADA ramps as necessary on a portion of Hammon Avenue located within the limits of Ephrata Borough (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, a portion of Hammon Avenue, approximately 400 LF of roadway between the Parties' shared municipal boundary and Meadow Valley Road, is located within Ephrata Township; and

WHEREAS, Ephrata Township similarly desires to replace the pavement on that 400 LF portion of Hammon Avenue located within Ephrata Township ("Township Paving Work"); and

WHEREAS, Ephrata Borough proposes to include the Township Paving Work in the Project in exchange for reimbursement of construction expenses for the Township Paving Work and payment of half of the overall engineering costs for bidding the Project; and

WHEREAS, the Ephrata Borough and Ephrata Township are authorized to cooperate in the performance of municipal functions, including those relating to roadway, roadway facilities, and the maintenance thereof, under the authority of 53 Pa.C.S. § 2301, *et seq.*, known as the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, the Parties recognize that cooperating and expanding the scope of the Project will result in beneficial cost savings and hereby desire to set forth the following agreed upon guidelines and procedures as essential to the orderly and systematic completion of the Project.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and conditions herein set forth, the parties hereto, each intending to be legally bound, covenant and agree as follows:

1. Recitals. The above recitals are incorporated herein by reference thereto and made a part of this Agreement.

2. Responsibilities. Ephrata Borough shall undertake the performance of all aspects of the Project which, pursuant to this Agreement, shall be defined to include the Township Paving Work. Ephrata Borough will undertake all preliminary planning, bidding, and contracting with respect to the Project. Ephrata Borough shall at all times comply and ensure compliance with all applicable statutes, regulations, rules, and ordinances with respect to the Project. The Parties anticipate that all work in connection with the Project will be performed between April 2024 and August 2024.

3. Scope of Cooperation. Ephrata Borough shall design the Project's scope of work and manage construction thereof through prepared contract documents. All Township Paving Work shall comply with all Ephrata Borough ordinances and construction plans unless otherwise agreed upon between the Parties.

4. Financing. Ephrata Borough shall front all costs for the Project. In consideration for Ephrata Borough undertaking the Project and completing the improvements benefiting Ephrata Township, Ephrata Township agrees to reimburse Ephrata Borough for the following:

- a. The construction costs of all bid items awarded in relation to the Township Paving Work; and
- b. Half of the engineering expenses incurred with bidding the Project (collectively, "Ephrata Township Payment").

5. Timing and Duration. The time for performance of the Parties' duties and obligations as set forth herein is deemed of the essence. This Agreement shall coincide with contract times set forth in the Project's contract documents and shall expire upon payment in full of the Ephrata Township Payment.

6. Administration. Ephrata Borough shall provide a single invoice to Ephrata Township at the completion of the Project, subject to reasonable delays as may be necessary, in accordance with the Project's contract documents. The Ephrata Township Payment shall be due and payable to Ephrata Borough within 30 days of receipt and shall be made in one lump sum payment. If payment is not timely made, the Ephrata Township Payment shall accrue non-compounding interest at the rate of one and one-half percent (1.5%) per month or any fraction thereof.

7. Future Maintenance. Nothing herein shall be construed to require either party to be responsible for the future operation or maintenance of the portion of Hammon Avenue located within the other Party's municipal boundaries.

8. Indemnification. To the extent allowed by law, Ephrata Township shall release, hold harmless, and indemnify Ephrata Borough, its officers, elected officials, agents, representatives, and employees acting within the scope of their official duties from and against any and all claims, suits, demands, actions, awards, losses, damages, and expenses, including but not limited to reasonable attorneys' fees, to the extent caused by the negligent and/or intentional acts, errors, or omissions of Ephrata Township, its employees, contractors, and/or agents, associated with, arising from, or related to the performance of its responsibilities under this Agreement, only to the extent that such liabilities arise from an action which can be properly brought against Ephrata Township as an exception to governmental immunity in accordance with the Political Subdivision Tort Claims Act, 42 Pa. C.S. § 8541, *et seq.* (the "Act") and in accordance with such limits of liability set forth in the Act.

9. Severability. No determination by any court, governing body, arbitration, or other judicial body, that any provision of this Agreement, or any amendment that may be created hereto, is invalid or unenforceable in any instance shall affect the validity or enforceability of any other provision of this Agreement or applicable amendment. Each provision shall be valid and

enforceable to the fullest extent permitted by applicable law and shall be construed where and whenever possible as being consistent with applicable law.

10. Controlling Laws. The laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania shall govern this Agreement, its interpretation and performance of any resulting claims. Any challenge to this Agreement shall be brought in the Lancaster County Court of Common Pleas.

11. Interpretation. The paragraph headings used herein are for reference and convenience only and shall not enter into the interpretation hereof.

12. Assignment. Neither party may assign this Agreement without the prior written consent of the other party.

13. Successors and Assigns. This Agreement shall be binding upon and will inure to the benefit of the parties hereto and their respective successors and assigns.

14. Merger. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the Parties hereto and supersedes all prior negotiations, understandings, and agreements of any nature whatsoever with respect to the subject matter hereof. No amendment, waiver, or discharge of any provision of this Agreement shall be effective against any party unless that Party shall have consented thereto in writing.

15. Authorized Signatures. The Parties hereby certify that the persons signing below are authorized to enter into this Agreement and to bind the Parties to the terms of this Agreement.

16. Counterparts. This Agreement may be executed in multiple counterparts, each of which shall constitute an original, but all of which shall constitute one and the same document. Signatures transmitted via facsimile or email shall have the same binding effect as original signatures.

17. Immunity Not Waived. Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed or interpreted as Ephrata Borough in any manner waiving or limiting the protection afforded to it by the Political Subdivision Tort Claims Act (42 Pa.C.S. § 8541, *et seq.*).

18. Severability. In the event any term of this Agreement shall be held invalid, illegal, or unenforceable in whole or in part, neither the validity of the remaining part of such term nor the validity of any other term of this Agreement shall in any way be affected thereby.

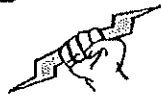
